

Match up the law with the description

Sale of Goods Act, 1979
and Supply of Goods Act,
1982

States it is illegal for products to be incorrectly described. For example, it would be illegal to say plastic shoes are made of leather

The Trade Descriptions Act, 1968

Products, when sold, must be undamaged and in good working order when they are supplied. They must be fit for the purpose of which they were brought.

Consumer Protection Act, 1987

Protects customers from defective goods and misleading pricing. For example a statement that a bar of chocolate is '50p less than the manufacturers recommended' price when it isn't.

Consumer Safety Act, 1978

Ensures food is safe and does not mislead customers in the way it is presented. For example if it is described in a misleading way

The Food Safety Act, 1990

Prevents sale of goods which might harm customers. It concentrates mainly upon safety of products like electrical goods including hairdryers
